Endorsement of Local laws and Mechanisms against SGBV

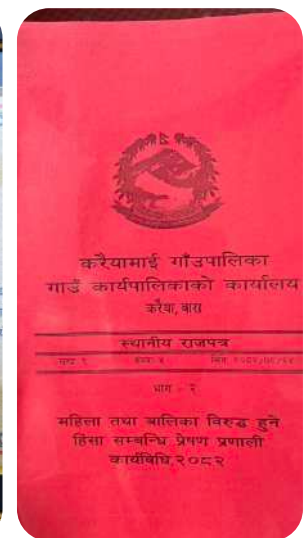
Different Municipalities around the country adopted laws and Policies against Sexual and Gender-based Violence (SGBV). FWLD, collaborated and supported the local organizations such as New Friends Club, Bara, Creative Institute Nepal (CIN), Information and Human Research Center (IHRC), VIDEH Foundation, and several Municipalities in drafting and adoption of the local laws and mechanisms

against (SGBV). Through a series of coordinated advocacy efforts, Municipalities adopted the laws and policies against SGBV, tailored to their needs and context. Following the adoption, the Municipalities in collaboration with FWLD and respective local organizations, disseminated the endorsed laws and policies publicly and also felicitated FWLD for the overall support.

- Baragadhi Rural Municipality (Bara) conducted public dissemination program of the Sexual Harassment at Work Place (Prevention) Code of Conduct 2082 on January 8, 2026.



- Karaiyamai Rural Municipality (Bara) publicly disseminated the 'Referral Guidelines to address the Violence against Women and Girls (VaWG), 2082'.



- Mahagadhimai Municipality (Bara) disseminated the adopted 'Sexual Harassment at Workplace (prevention) Code of Conduct, 2082' on January 19, 2026.



- In Nepalgunj Sub-Metropolitan City, Banke a discussion meeting on draft 'Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention) Code of Conduct, 2082' was conducted on January 7, 2026, and it was handed over to the Municipality on January 21, 2026.





- In Suddhodhan Rural Municipality, a feedback meeting on the draft of 'Guidelines on the Referral Pathway for victims of Violence against Women and Girls, 2082' was conducted on January 9, and the Municipality disseminated the Guidelines on February 5, 2026.



- On February 5, 2026, the coordination meeting discussed and finalized the public dissemination of the previously endorsed 'Directive for the Referral Pathway for the victims of VaWG' through hoarding board establishments.



Mapping the Existing Service and Mechanism Priority of Local Government (Karnali Province) and Gaps to Work on the GBV including Referral Pathway

FWLD conducted ‘Mapping and Orientation Programs of Policies against Violence against Women and Girls (VaWG)’ on January 7, 2026 in Hima Municipality (Jumla), on January 9, 2026 in Kanaka Sundari Rural Municipality (Jumla), on January 11, 2026 in Narharinath Rural Municipality, on January 13 in Raskot Municipality, and on January 18, 2026 in Sanni Triveni Rural Municipality.

These meetings were conducted in the presence of elected representatives, members of the Executive Committee, members of the Judicial committee, representatives of civil society organizations, Nepal Police, and Child club. FWLD oriented the participants on different types of

SGBV, laws against SGBV and the role of the local government to address SGBV and provide victim-centric justice in their Municipalities. Furthermore, FWLD also highlighted the major local laws required like Ac Act to operate GBV Elimination Fund, Rehabilitation Centre and Fund, Service Centre and Fund, Referral Guideline to address victims of VaWG, Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention) Code of Conduct, along with others. The Municipalities shared and discussed about the existing forms of SGBV and existing laws and policies if there was any. At the end, the needs of the Municipalities in terms of adoption of laws and policies against SGBV were identified.

Sharing of Identified Gaps and Planning Meeting with Local Governments (Karnali Province)

Following the mapping of the existing service and mechanism against SGBV, FWLD shared the findings to the Municipalities on January 8, 2026 in Hima Rural Municipality, January 10, 2026 in Kanaka Sundari Rural Municipality, on January 12, 2026 in Narharinath Rural Municipality, January 14, 2026 in Raskot Municipality, and on January 19, 2026 in Sanni Triveni Rural Municipality. Through these programs, the respective Municipalities identified the necessary laws and policies that they were required to adopt to address SGBV in their Municipalities. Utilising the need assessment and the platform, Municipalities and FWLD came to a conclusion where FWLD agreed to help Municipalities in drafting the respective laws and Policies against SGBV.

Raskot Municipality, Kalikot and Sanni Triveni Rural Municipality, Kalikot decided to adopt three documents –

- Act for the Establishment and Operation of a Fund and Service Centre for the Protection of Victims of Gender-Based Violence, Human Trafficking, and Domestic Violence
- Guideline on Referral System to address VAWG
- Sexual Harassment at Workplace (Prevention) Code of Conduct

Whereas, other Municipalities decided to adopt the Act for the Establishment and Operation of a Fund and Service Centre for the Protection of Victims of Gender-Based Violence, Human Trafficking, and Domestic Violence.

Media Interaction on Local Policy Initiative to Address VaWG

On January 9, 2026 FWLD organized a 'Media Interaction on Local Policy Initiative to address VaWG' in Kalaiya Bara. The program discussed on the need to endorse local laws against VaWG in the presence of officers from Devtal Rural Municipality, and Kalaiya Sub-Metropolitan City, and journalist.



Similar event was also conducted by FWLD in Nepalgunj, Banke on January 19, 2026. Through the program, FWLD highlighted the importance of local laws to address VaWG and it was conducted

in the presence of representatives and officials from Badhaiyatal Rural Municipality, Janaki Rural Municipality, Nepalgunj Sub-metropolitan city, and journalists.



Ward Level Orientation Program on VaWG



FWLD in collaboration with VIDEH Foundation conducted ward-level orientation program against VaWG on January 21 in Mahadeva Rural Municipality, Saptari where the elected representatives, and relevant officers of the Municipalities were oriented about the role of the Municipalities to address VaWG and to provide victim-centric justice.



Women Federation and Inter-party Women Network were oriented for Local Policy Advocacy against VaWG on February 2, 2026 in Kanchan Rural Municipality, Shantinagar.

Forum Theatre on GBV & Digital Violence

FWLD organized a Forum Theatre performance titled "Swotantira Paila (A Step of Freedom)" on in various dates and venues in collaboration with Malika Media.

The performance aimed to raise community awareness on Gender-Based Violence (GBV)

with a specific focus on digital violence, emphasizing the need to break silence and challenge harmful norms.

Each session was followed by interactive dialogues where students and community members analyzed the issues and proposed solutions, which

were then enacted by the artists, creating a participatory learning environment.

Participants highlighted the importance of speaking out, seeking police support, and using existing legal remedies to ensure justice and safety.

3 days Multi-Stakeholder Discussion Program on Addressing SGBV through Victim-centric Approach and SRHR

FWLD organized a 3 days Multi-Stakeholder Discussion Program on Addressing SGBV through Victim-centric Approach and SRHR. The participants represented the Parsa District Court, the One-stop Crisis Management Center (OCMC), District Government Attorney's Office, District Police Office, Legal Aid Committee, Stipend lawyers, law practitioners, mediators, and judicial committee participated in the program.

The participants were engaged in discussions through sessions conducted by resource persons such as Honourable Judge Madhav Prasad Ghimire, District attorney Mr. Manoj Prasad. Gupta, Deputy Superintendent of Police Mr. Raju Karki, Dr. Surendra Pd. Chaudhary

representative from Narayani Provincial Hospital (OCMC), Advocate Sabin Shrestha delivered sessions for the participants.

The sessions highlighted the following subjects:

- Conceptual understanding on Sex, Gender, Sexuality
- Definition, types and legal provisions on various SGBV
- Rights of victims of SGBV,
- Gender responsive and victim centric investigation
- Judicial Perspectives on SGBV cases
- Interim Relief and Compensation to Victims
- Medical jurisprudence and protection of evidence

The sessions were followed by a mock trial in which participants

representing their respective institutions, and role-played on a hypothetical case of domestic violence. Participants shared that they were able to look at an issue from victim's perspective and could also reflect on possible areas of improvement to make the services Victim-centric.

A special performance on "Digital Violence named- Swotanttra Paila (A Step of Freedom)" was also showcased during the program. The drama gave an insight towards the current issues of digital violence and traps victims get into. The drama emphasizing the importance of breaking silence, seeking support from law enforcement, and using legal mechanisms to ensure justice, safety, and dignity for survivors.

Collaboration and Partnership Planning Meeting with CSOs for Voter Education

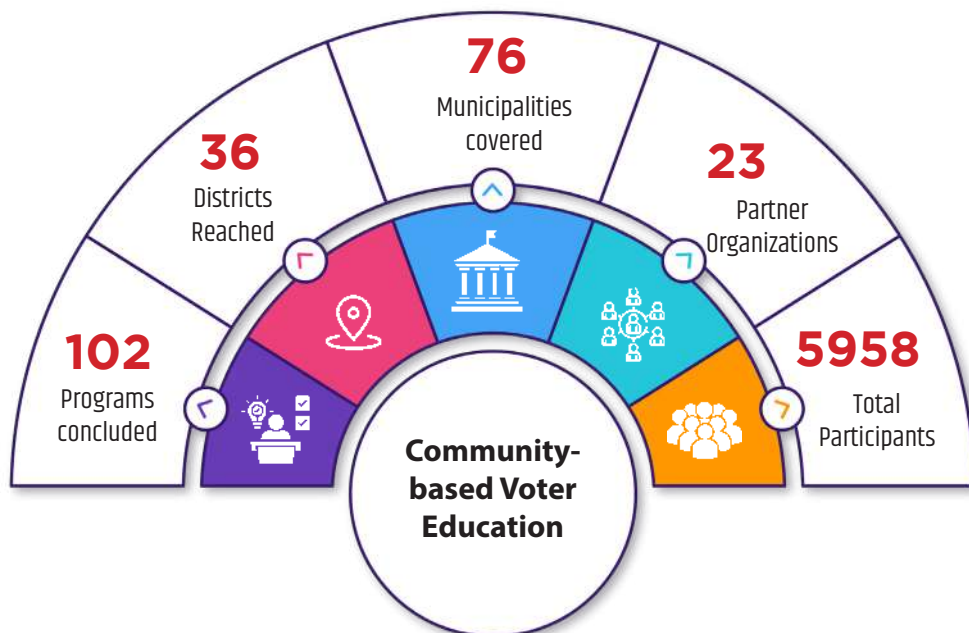

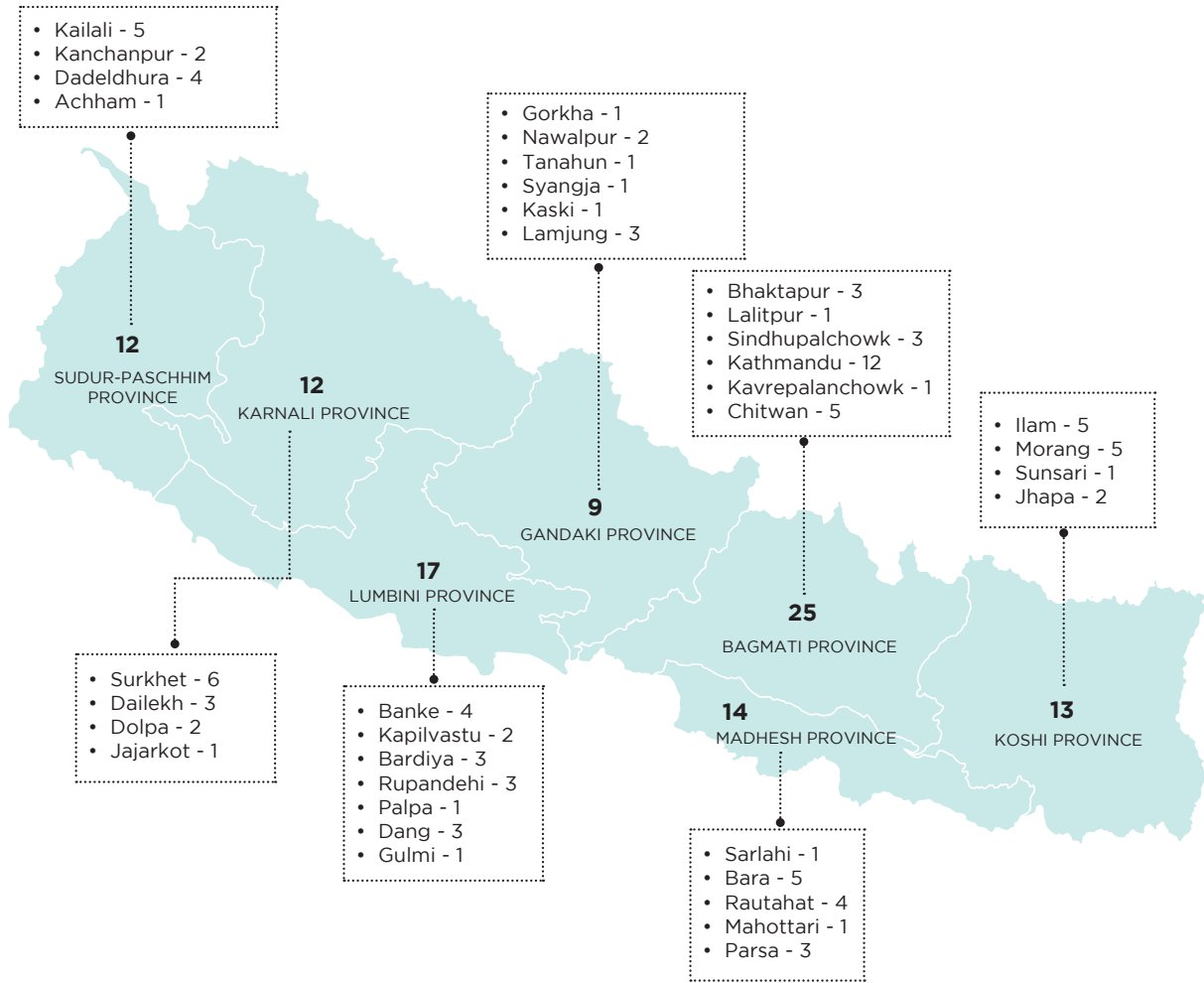

and others. Advocate Sabin Shrestha highlighted the program's objectives, detailing the modalities for voter education and the sub-granting process to support community-level implementation. 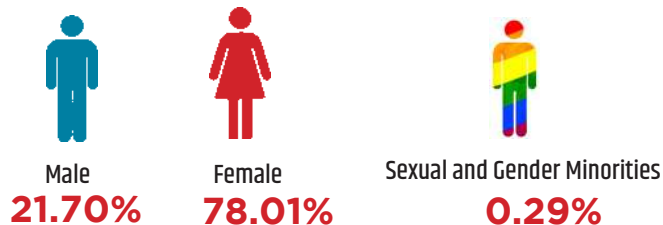




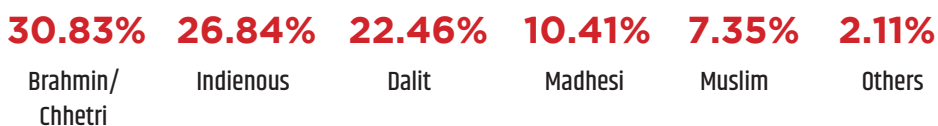
Overview

FWLD, in collaboration with 23 Civil Society Organizations, conducted Community-Based Voter Education programs ahead of the House of Representatives Election 2082, spanning all seven provinces of Nepal, across 36 districts and 76 municipalities. The initiative was grounded in the recognition that access to electoral information and meaningful democratic participation is not uniform across all segments of society. It was designed with a strong emphasis on inclusivity and social equity, ensuring that those who have historically faced structural, social, economic, and informational barriers to civic participation were reached, informed, and empowered.

Collaboration Meeting on GEDSI Observation of Upcoming Election

✦ January 7, 2026, Kathmandu ✦

FWLD organized a vibrant discussion with 20 civil society representatives on observing the upcoming election through a Gender, Disability, and Social Inclusion (GEDSI) lens in Kathmandu. Representatives from diverse sectors, including disability rights, child rights, media, safe houses, marginalized communities, grassroots women's empowerment, women's rights, and the rights of people living with HIV, participated and shared insights, and explored collaborative pathways to reach the majority of districts and the maximum number of electoral constituencies. Senior Advocate Meera Dhungana highlighted the objective of the program, while Advocate Sagar Pathak presented the modality of election observation from a GEDSI perspective. Advocate Smriti Moktan welcomed the participants and moderated the program. The meeting concluded with a shared commitment to work together to ensure inclusive elections.

FWLD conducted a comprehensive training for election observers for the election of the House of Representatives. The observation will be carried out from a GEDSI perspective, with a strong focus on inclusive, free, and fair electoral processes. A total of 10 election observers, ensuring meaningful

intersectional representation across gender, caste, and ethnicity, participated in the training. The session provided a detailed orientation on the election observation guidelines, the election code of conduct, and the ethical responsibilities of observers. Observers were also thoroughly trained on the observation tools and the use of

the Kobo app for accurate, real-time submission of observation reports. The training aimed to strengthen the capacity of observers to effectively observe the electoral process and document key GEDSI related issues, contributing to credible and evidence-based election observation.

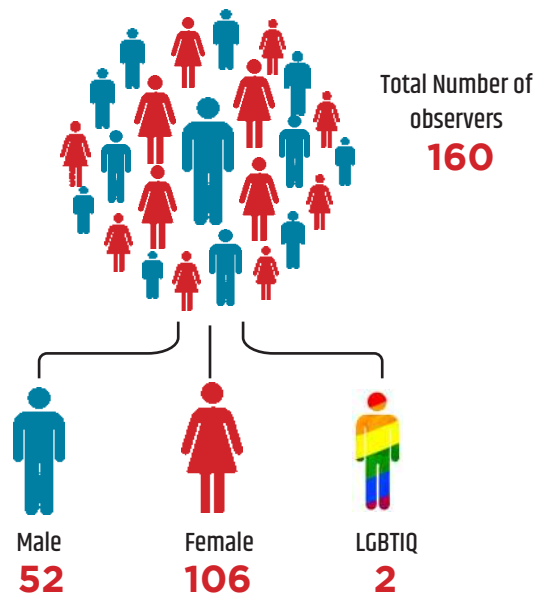

Observation of the House of Representatives Election 2082

✦ March 7, 2026, Kathmandu ✦

FWLD, in collaboration with 14 CSOs, conducted observation of the House of Representatives Election 2082 from a GEDSI (Gender Equality, Disability and Social Inclusion) perspective. The observation was conducted by a total of 160 observers, including 106 females, 52 males, and 2 LGBTIQ. In terms of caste and ethnicity, 91 were Brahmins, 42 Indigenous, 17 Dalits, and 5 Madhesis. Regarding age distribution, 99 observers were between 18–49 years, while 3 were above 50 years. Additionally, 4 observers were persons with disabilities. The Observation was conducted during the pre-election, election day, and post-election periods across 24 districts in all 7 provinces, covering a total of 46 constituencies, 55 Local Levels and 156 voting centers to assess the inclusiveness, accessibility, and fairness of the electoral process.

'Polling centres were not inclusive'

Rights activists who monitored the House of Representatives election held on March 5 said that the polling centres were not gender-friendly, disability-friendly, or inclusive. Worst still, some polling officers held negative views about women accusing the election monitor of appeasing their foreign donors.

At the event where the preliminary election observation report was made public—prepared by 15 different non-governmental organisations under the leadership of the Forum for Women, Law and Development (FWLD)—participants said that the government employees' work at polling centres was not carried out according to the guidelines prepared by the Election Commission, and that further analysis of polling centres is necessary.

FWLD Advocate Sagar Pathak presented the re-

counting process using the gender equality and social inclusion (GESI) observation method.

Pathak informed that the report was prepared through direct observation of 160 polling booths in 24 districts across seven provinces. He also said that the observers received approval from the Election Commission late, which left insufficient time for preparation. However, 160 observers were trained and deployed to polling centres in all seven provinces.

FWLD Executive Director and advocate Sabin Shrestha said that polling centres were not prepared according to the guidelines issued by the Election Commission.

He stated, "We did not find polling stations that met the minimum standards. Since polling centres themselves lacked sufficient information, it is necessary to conduct detailed analysis of polling centres in the future."

Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights in Political Parties' Election Manifestos

✦ January 28, 2026, Kathmandu ✦

Forum for Women, Law and Development (FWLD) and the Center for Reproductive Rights (CRR) submitted an advocacy letter to the major political parties including the Nepal Communist Party (UML), Nepali Congress, Nepal Communist Party, Rastriya Prajatantra Party, Janata Samajbadi Party and Rastriya Swatantra Party at their respective offices. The advocacy letter was submitted in the context of the House of Representatives elections, which was scheduled on March 5, 2026, with the objective of urging the political parties to include essential reproductive health service issues in their election manifestos.

Expectations and Commitments in the Manifestos Prepared by Political Parties

- Commitment to include the need for necessary amendments and reforms in the laws related to sexual and reproductive health, particularly those related to abortion.
- Commitment to ensure that all reproductive health services, particularly family planning and abortion services, are accessible, affordable, and of high quality.

Demand to ensure sexual and reproductive health rights in election manifestos

The Forum for Women, Law and Development (FWLD) and the Centre for Reproductive Rights (CRR) visited the central offices of major political parties, including the CPN-UML, Nepali Congress, Nepali Communist Party, Rastriya Prajatantra Party, Janata Samajwadi Party-Nepal, and Rastriya Swatantra Party,

and handed over the advocacy letters to the top leadership of the parties, urging them to make clear commitments regarding reproductive health services. The advocacy letter demanded that the political parties make a clear commitment in their election manifesto to ensure sexual and reproductive health rights of women, adolescent girls, and all citizens in practice, in ac-

cordance with constitution. The letter urged the political parties to clearly state in their manifestos their commitment to timely revision and reform of existing laws related to abortion, arguing that such a revision could facilitate women's access to safe and legal abortion services. The rights bodies also demanded policies in manifestos to ensure that all reproductive health services.

Discussion on Recommendations Regarding SRHR to the UPR under the 4th cycle of the UN Human Rights Council

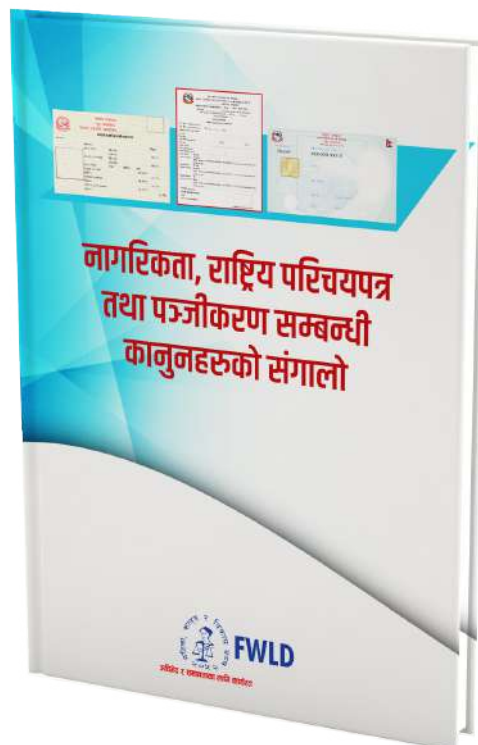
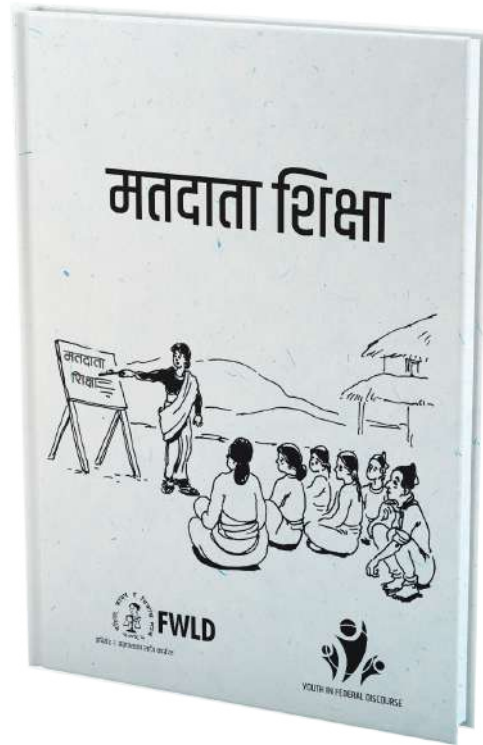

enforcement driven approaches: "In less than a year, our partner network has helped stop or prevent nearly 500,000 child marriages in India."

From April 2023 to February 2026, Just Rights for Children (JRC) said its partners in India rescued more than 135,000 children from trafficking and forced labour and connected more than 2 million vulnerable families to government social protection programmes. With the support of the State of Youth platform, initiated by Kids Rights, the message to end child marriage has now reached nearly 100 counties including Nepal.

He added, the World Day for the Elimination of Child Marriage would focus the world on enforcing the laws that already exist and on holding institutions accountable.

Addressing the summit, Fatima Maada Bio, the First Lady of Sierra Leone stated, "Child marriage is not culture. It is not tradition. It is rape. When political will meets the rule of law, change happens." Sierra Leone has one of Africa's strictest laws against child marriage with penalties of up to 15 years' imprisonment for those participating in or attending underage marriages.

At a panel discussion organised by Beyond Beijing Committee Chairperson Krishna Waiba, Sabin Shrestha, Executive Director and Advocate of the Forum for Women, Law and Development (FWLD), informed that the organisation has been running legal aid programmes to enhance reproductive health rights and access to justice for women and girls with disabilities.

He also pointed out the need for disability-friendly and accessible judicial guidelines to ensure equal access to justice.

An estimated 12 million girls are married before the age of 18 each year worldwide, according to UN agencies.

Recently, JRC Nepal in collaboration with National Child Right Council (NCRC) concluded the child marriage-free Nepal 100 Days National Campaign (2022) showcasing achievements, lessons learned and future

'Need disability-friendly, accessible judicial guidelines to ensure equal access to justice'

Minister of Women, Children and Senior Citizens Shradha Shrestha stated at an international gathering in New York, United States that although Nepal has introduced many legal provisions to protect the rights of women and girls, further effort is still required to effectively implement those provisions in practice.
